

## **Birding Maine**

Three members of the SOBG headed to Maine the last week of July through August 4, primarily to see and photography Atlantic Puffins, but also to find pelagic birds on two whale watches, and Nancy Gallagher, Nancy Lynch, and Sue Puder were not disappointed. We also saw over a dozen lighthouses, 4 Humpback and 1 Minke whale, Atlantic White-sided Dolphins, Harbor Porpoises, a Mola Mola (Ocean Sunfish), and gray and harbor seals. We would highly recommend the Cape Ann Whale Watching trip, the Bar Harbor Whale Watching tour, and especially Machias Seal Island trip from Bold Coast Charter Company.
