Tuckerton Christmas Bird Count Rescheduled



The SOBG will conduct the rescheduled 2018 Tuckerton Christmas Bird Count on January 5, 2019, all day. Morry Kapitan is leading our count this year with able assistance from our veteran leader, Linda Gangi. It starts at 7 a.m., meeting at the

Tuckerton Seaport parking lot. You can volunteer for half a day (morning or afternoon), or the whole day. We will break at 11 for lunch at the Dynasty Diner on Rt. 9, Tuckerton. At 5 p.m. we will gather at the Hunting Shanty to review our counts for the day and share some pizza and drinks. A great way to end **The Year of the Bird!**

The Christmas Bird Count is a census of birds in the Western Hemisphere, performed annually in the early Northern-hemisphere winter by volunteer birdwatchers and administered by the National Audubon Society. The purpose is to provide population data for use in science, especially conservation biology, though many people participate for recreation. Important Issues

- Conserve Wildlife Foundation of NJ needs to raise money to keep its Bald Eagle Project going next year. They did a wonderful program for us this fall, so if you would like to help, visit: <u>gofundme.com/savenjeagles</u>
- The current administration is planning to weaken federal clean water rules designed to protect millions of acres of wetlands and thousands of miles of streams nationwide from pesticide runoff and other pollutants. Once the proposal is announced, there will be a 60-day period to comment. Google "WOTUS II" for more information.
- The current administration has also given permits for seismic exploration in the Atlantic Ocean in preparation for oil drilling off the East Coast. We may have a program on this issue next year.
