## Field Trip February 16



The next field trip is scheduled for February 16 in conjunction with The Great Backyard Bird Count. This year we plan on heading north for the count, starting at the Lake of the Lilies in Point Pleasant Beach and Manasquan Inlet.

We will meet at the Forked River rest area (north end) on the Garden State Parkway at 8 a.m. to carpool. If you wish, you can meet us at the Lake of the Lilies at around 8:30-8:45 a.m. If light showers, the trip is on, heavy rain cancels. Check FB or your email for updates.

Says Dr. Gary Langham, vice president and chief scientist for the National Audubon Society: "The Great Backyard Bird Count is a great way for all bird watchers to contribute to a global database of bird populations. Participants in the Great Backyard Bird Count help scientists understand how things like climate change are impacting bird populations so we can better inform our conservation efforts."

# **Wings Over LBI**



The 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Wings Over LBI Birding Festival will be held on March 16, 2019.

The event is held in partnership with the Friends of Barnegat Lighthouse State Park, the Long Beach Island Foundation of the Arts and Sciences, and the

Southern Ocean County Chamber of Commerce. The event will be filled with learning about and watching birds in action. It is suitable for the whole family and newcomers to birding.

The Science Saturday program at the Long Beach Island Foundation in Loveladies, 11:00 a.m., will be "Birding the Pine Barrens" presented by Susan Puder. The is a \$5 charge by the LBIF if you are not a member.

The free presentation at Barnegat Lighthouse State Park at 1 p.m. will be "The World of Birds Around Us in New Jersey" by Pete Bacinski. This is a program designed for the whole family featuring backyard bird and birds you can see here in NJ. He will also discuss birds that winter in our area along the coast.

Throughout the day members of the SOBG will be along the jetty with scopes to help visitors identify the birds in and around the inlet. After the program at 1 is over, members of SOBG will lead a walk along side of the jetty for better views of eiders, scoters, harlequins, sandpipers, and maybe Snow Buntings. We usually see first of the year Piping Plovers showing up, too.

The SOBG will have tables at both events to sell our field guides, which goes to our scholarship fund. Volunteers are Needed!
