Tuckerton Christmas Bird Count

On Saturday, December 18th the Tuckerton Circle will hold its Christmas Bird count for 2021. This is a notice for the event and a call for participants.

Every year the National Audubon Society conducts this event, and the Tuckerton Circle count is organized by the Southern Ocean Birding Group. The CBC is the longest running citizen science project in North America. The purpose is to identify bird species that are present, and the data is subsequently used conservation activities and other research.

This will be a fun event and both new and experienced birders can help out. Participants will be organized into groups and look for birds from dawn to dusk.

I will be organizing the teams and assigning count sectors in advance of the count and emailing out the count materials. More details will follow once I know who will be participating. If you can't attend for the whole day that is fine. Your choices are all day, morning, or afternoon.

We usually meet at the Dynasty Diner in Tuckerton for lunch. If you want to skip lunch that is fine. Also, if you are fully vaccinated, Nancy Lynch has offered to host a post count meetup at her home with pizza and soda to discuss the count at 5pm. Sunset looks to be at about 4:33pm on the count day.

The SOBG Calendar should be updated in the next few weeks with program dates along with dates for field trips and target species.


We will be renting the same Cape House as this year, either the last week in September or first in October. More details will follow next year.
