Tuckerton Christmas Bird Count by Morry Kapitan

On Saturday, December 18th, 21 birders of varied experience gathered to participate in the 122nd annual Christmas Bird Count. While this is a national event sponsored by the National Audubon Society, the SOBG organizes the count for the local area centered around Tuckerton. SOBG members make up the majority of persons attending, although this year we had counters from both Burlington and Morris counties rounding out the effort. Six of the counters were first timers for the Tuckerton count (thanks folks!), and all participants were organized into nine teams to cover the entire area we had to count.

Mid December weather is sometimes unpredictable, but we lucked out with temperatures in the upper 40's to low 50's and open water in the ponds and marshes. The species and individual totals were pretty interesting. Our own Greg Prelich had a quick look over the data and here are his comments regarding how we did this year:

Looking through the data and comparing it to the past 12 years, when SOBG re-vitalized the count:

First the positive numbers:

Although short of our record of 96 species from last year, the total of 89 species this year is way over our average of 73 species over the past 12 years.

Four species were new for the count (YAY): Shortbilled/Long-billed Dowitcher, Sedge Wren, Laughing Gull, Western Kingbird.

We had new highs for: Mallards, Northern Shovelers, Ring-necked Ducks, Long-tailed Ducks, Bald Eagles (25 vs previous high of 15 !!), Greater Yellowlegs, Belted Kingfisher, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Downy Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Carolina Chickadee, Winter Wren, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Gray Catbird, Cedar Waxwing, Fox Sparrow, White-throated Sparrow, Northern Cardinal, House Finch. These numbers probably reflect good coverage and relatively warm temperatures with plenty of open water for waterfowl.

These were the first Wood Ducks (4) seen in the last 12 years since SOBG revived the count. Yellow-rumped Warblers new record of 579 far surpassed the previous high of 328!

And now for some downward trends or misses: The number of Brant (9) is by far the lowest ever. Previous low was 55. Red-breasted Mergansers were missed for the first time in 10 years. New low for Dunlin. Big drop in Boat-tailed Grackles. Brown-headed Cowbirds was another somewhat glaring miss that we find in more than 50% of our Christmas Bird Counts.

So, a really good result and solid data that will help research into the future. Thank you again for all who participated.

The next Christmas Bird Count will tentatively be on Saturday, December 17, 2022, and the call will go out via email in mid-November should you want to join in on the fun next year - there really is something for birders of every experience level. We hope to see you on next year's count.
