- The 2023 Great Backyard Bird Count exceeded all expectations. Organizers estimate that more than 500,000 participants from around the globe made the latest count the best ever. Participants reported 7,538 bird species and uploaded more than 151,000 photos, videos, and sounds.

 - 7,538 species of birds identified.
 - 202 participating countries
 - 390,652 eBird checklists
 - 372,905 Merlin Bird IDs
 - 151,479 photos added to Macaulay Library

Wing Over LBI—March 18, 2023

A cold windy day greeted the group of about 20 birders as they started “Wings Over LBI” this with only field trips to three great birding locations. First was Cedar Bonnet Island, part of Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge, where several meadowlarks appeared, and one orange-crowned warbler were the highlights of the morning.

Next the group, where several dropped off and others joined in at Barnegat Lighthouse State Park for a few hours of exploring the jetty. Harlequins didn’t disappoint, along with oystercatchers, Ipswich Sparrow, Long-tailed



ducks, loons, and purple sandpipers made appearances.

The last stop for the day was Holgate, at the southern end of the LBI and also a unit of Forsythe NWR. Ocean birds were flying by, including scoters, horned grebes, and more oystercatchers.
